
Bringing our colleagues onboard our Journey to Better

To support our ambitious sustainable development strategy, we have created a comprehensive series of in-house training courses, covering social value and community engagement, climate change, managing environmental risk, and waste management. These courses help to improve our colleague's knowledge of sustainable practices, as well as providing them with the insight to apply this knowledge to their role.

In close consultation with Watts Sustainability and sustainability membership organisation, IEMA, we regularly host bespoke online training courses throughout the year, and via a virtual classroom during the Covid crisis. The one-day courses provide SWR colleagues the opportunity to achieve their IEMA Environmental Sustainability Skills for the Workforce, a professional qualification for sustainability.

The Institute of Environmental Management and Assessment (IEMA) is the lead sustainability organisation with over 15,000 members both here in the UK and worldwide. Delivering training which is IEMA accredited ensures that our training is of the highest quality, and ensures our colleagues are learning from a leading voice in sustainability.

Knowledge for all

It is important that we clearly communicate our approach to sustainability and the sustainable practices we follow to everyone, so we can all be on our Journey to Better together.

For this reason our courses developed in partnership with Watts Sustainability are accessible for all our suppliers and community rail partnerships to attend. We have also developed a concise guide to sustainability to inform all of our station teams, temporary agency workers and community teams on managing the rises of pollution, energy wastage and ways to increase recycling. We're currently working on expanding this guide for agency colleagues working in our Train Presentation teams too.



Delivering best practice: making sustainability training interactive, relevant and fun

We recognise that not everyone can attend a full day's course on sustainability. That's why we have worked closely with the business to develop bespoke interactive 25 minute modules. These are developed to be role specific making them relevant to colleagues own experience at SWR. These will sit within our central training system allowing access for all and the ability to record attendance.

The modules are interactive and arm colleagues with the knowledge required to identify and understand environmental risks within their area of work, and subsequently how to mitigate these.

Courses are currently available for our colleagues working in engineering functions, and they also form part of the regular sustainability awareness training delivered to the wider businesses.

We are continuing to expand the accessibility of these modules to other teams at SWR including all our customer experience colleagues.



Continual improvement

We are proud to have been certified against ISO 14001 & 50001 since 2018. Watts Sustainability has supported us with the training materials required to maintain these accreditations.

We have helped improve our Environment Management System (EMS) - used for performance improvement to reduce environmental impacts and energy use. We have also developed a new guide to our EMS to ensure it is accessible and informative for all our staff and contractors.

We value the importance of sustainability and the need for all practices to become more sustainable for the future of rail, our customers and the environment.




Collaboration
