Stations in Bloom



The awards ceremony followed SWR's 'The Big Bulb Plant Out', during which staff and volunteers planted over 17,000 bulbs across the network as part of National Customer Service Week.

Planting took place at 35 of our stations, including West Byfleet, Wool, Effingham Junction, Feniton, Shanklin, Feltham, and Templecombe (left).

The spring bulbs will breath colourful new life into stations when they begin to bloom early next year, helping to make our network more welcoming and enjoyable for customers.

They will also enhance the biodiversity of the network, creating places for animals and insects to thrive. Paula Aldridge, SWR Community Rail Manager, said *1t is really great to see so many of our station adopters and volunteers coming together to create a pleasant environment for customers.*





SWR Community Rail Conference 2022
